

I love one act plays, especially one act comedies. You have 20 to 25 minutes to develop characters, a plot and have a great ending. All without sets or elaborate lighting and sound, the one act comedy is a bigger challenge than you'd think it is. I have read hundreds of one act plays and weeding them down to a series of 3 or 4 plays to come together as a single production... well, that's the fun part.

So here we are at our second kick at the can. First off, I must thank Theatre Woodstock and especially Sue Robinson for stepping up and offering to give us a home for our second Festival of One Act Plays. I brought on three new Directors this time including myself. The Director Team is always a mixture of experience and perspective. Even with over a decade of theatre experience, I have never actually directed a play before. Dez has only directed kids and John R. has more experience than Dez and myself put together and I knew that we would make a fabulous team, feeding off each other to create an evening that will split your sides from laughter.

There are a few people, who I must thank for their vital contribution to this production. First off is Pam Hagen who is experiencing theatre for the very first time. She assisted me in producing the production and then stepped up to act as the Assistant Stage Manager for all the plays. She was simply the best sounding board I've ever worked with, and we made a beautiful team.
