"The dining room. Notice how we gravitate to it."

Arthur, played by Michael Charles, opens his scene with those words. For better or for worse, the dining room in years gone by was the centre of family life. And in this series of eighteen vignettes, you will see a variety of families in a variety of situations – many of which will seem familiar to you.

This play was originally penned in the 1980's as a kind of homage to a place, both physical and spiritual, that was quickly falling out of fashion. And now, some forty years later, it is truer than ever. Several characters in the play lament on the passage of time and the loss of traditions. And this play pre-dates the Internet and cell phones!

There is humour, nostalgia, intrigue, tenderness and a sense of sadness – often all at the same time. Six very talented actors will lead you through these eighteen short scenes which on the surface seem to be unconnected. If you look deeper, you will see the threads of humanity that connect us all.




