DIRECTOR'S NOTES



There are many musicals that would be impossible to perform in 2023.

Or if not impossible, then difficult and distasteful. Gilbert and Sullivan's classic operetta *The Mikado*, for example, is a show that has largely been laid to rest, since it's impossible to perform it in a manner that respects the culture it parodies. The beautiful music is better enjoyed in isolation.

South Pacific is another that comes to mind. Hurtful stereotypes are written into the script, and even though many of the POC roles are nuanced, it doesn't do enough to reverse that harm.

So what makes Guys and Dolls different?

I think the humour sets it apart. Although it's very possible that the old-fashioned "Men from Mars, women from Venus" gender warfare was played perfectly seriously in its day, it's easy to poke fun at it in the year 2023.

It's clearly satire when loving couples evidently dislike each other.

It's a fantasy that any person could be "tamed" by marriage.

It's laughable that Adelaide would wait so long and not move on to greener pastures, or realize that a license doesn't make a good partnership.

Just as the attitudes toward drinking and gambling (Gasp! The horror!) have changed and relaxed, so have such rigid gender roles. Guys and Dolls provides a snapshot of recent history--however exaggerated--that we can look back at and laugh.

And learn. And grow.

Please enjoy this show for what it is: Firecracker music, vibrant characters, and a darn good yarn. We hope you get swept away to the Big Apple, and into the world of crapshooters, mission dolls and show girls, then land back squarely on your feet.







